"Just This": A Four-Week Book Study Mondays, October 12 - November 2 at 6:30pm

In today's stressful and often disconnected world, we've found that creating a little space to gather can make a big difference; a chance to slow down, get to know one another, and talk about things that really matter. Larry and Cathi Nelson are going to lead a **four-week conversation group** around the small book of reflections called, *Just This* by Fr. Richard Rohr. It's a short, beautiful book with just four chapters.

Each week, we'll explore one simple theme:

**Awe
Waking Up
Surrendering
Practices**

We know how busy life can be, so we're keeping it intentionally simple:

We are excited to share that our Bluetooth-enabled hearing assist equipment, Williams WaveCAST, is up and running in the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. Our A/V technicians and Minister of Music are ready to support you in using this technology during worship.

To set you up for success, please do the following **before** coming to church:

1. Ensure your hearing aids are compatible with Bluetooth.
2. Enable Bluetooth on your phone and connect your hearing aids.
3. Download the Williams WaveCAST app in the [Google Play Store](#) or [Apple App Store](#).

When you **arrive**

1. Connect to the **westpresby-guest** wifi. Signs with the password are in the back of the Sanctuary.
2. Open the WaveCAST app (making sure your hearing aids are connected to your phone).
3. Search for: Main Sanctuary in the app.

BONUS: Tap the heart icon next to the room and save it as a favorite so you don't need to look it up again.

To use the app, drag your finger along the slider to increase or decrease the volume. Press **play** to begin the feed and **stop** to pause it. That's it!

If you plan on using the technology for the first time, you are encouraged to **come at least 15 minutes early** so we have plenty of time to assist you if needed. Should your hearing aids not work with Bluetooth, no problem! We have other options for individual sound amplification. Email Callie at music@westpresby.org or check in with an A/V tech if you want to learn more.

Dillard wrote the beautiful book "Pilgrim at Tinker Creek," and from it comes this quote: *"The answer must be, I think, that beauty and grace are performed whether or not we will or sense them. The least we can do is try to be there."*

As followers of Christ, we believe this - that beauty and grace are everywhere, even in the midst of grief and death, even in the midst of the war and suffering we see all around us.
