Westminster Lifts Mask Requirement

Last week, Session voted to pass the following motion from the Way Forward Team regarding wearing masks in our church facilities:

Based on current public health data, the Way Forward Team recommends Westminster Presbyterian Church change the mask-wearing policy to optional at this time. Masks are encouraged for those who are unvaccinated or who may be at higher risk. This policy includes worship on Sundays, any music group rehearsals, inperson meetings and the gatherings of our rental groups. Communion can be served via intinction and coffee hour can resume. If there is a return to a significant spike in Covid-19 cases in our community, the Way Forward Team will look at public health data and meet to determine if we will return to requiring masks.
