

In this festive season, many feel heaviness, worry and grief. This service provides an opportunity to come together to hear words and music of comfort, to sit in silence and to pray.


Christmas Eve - Communion and Candlelight

Advent Study: "Names of the Messiah" Mondays at 6:30 p.m. In-Person and Online Led by Rev. Julie Emery

Join the Rev. Julie Emery for an Advent Study: "Names for the Messiah" on Mondays at 6:30 p.m., in-person or on Zoom

Christians have claimed from their beginnings that Jesus was the Messiah foretold in the Hebrew Scriptures. What were these expectations, and did Jesus fulfill them?

The prophet Isaiah shared a well-known and beloved oracle that uses four titles to describe the Messiah: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Our study will look at the ways people understood these royal titles and how Jesus did or did not fulfill these titles.

Using this study by Walter Bruggeman, and delving into other prophetic sources such as Richard Rohr's new "The Tears of Things," as well as Dietrich Bonhoeffer's words from the Nazi prison camp, we will ponder the way these prophetic words and titles speak to our lives even now. Westminster Session Highlights November 19, 2025 Meeting

The Session met with joy and thanksgiving as we continue to see signs of growth, stewardship, and community connection at Westminster, particularly reflecting on our successful and impactful 75th anniversary

celebration.

Highlights from the Session Meeting include:

1. Housing/Rental Update

The Housing Development team has applied for a grant from the New England Housing Ministry to fund two proposals to further our fact finding for potential alternative use of the church property. The proposals are from a consultant group that specializes in affordable housing as well as an architect who will look specifically at the possibilities for our property. The goal is to keep all options open and continue to learn and explore possibilities while we actively pursue rental options.

Meanwhile, the opportunity with the YMCA continues to advance. Following approval of the Memorandum of Understanding for the YMCA to rent space at Westminster for its 2026 summer camp, the Rental Partner Group is now confirming zoning with the Town of West Hartford.

2. Financial Update

Treasurer Kevin Morrison, after eight years of service, will be stepping out of this role. Session will be seeking a new Treasurer. A job description will be defined shortly and shared with the congregation. We are deeply grateful for Kevin's faithful service to the Westminster community.

Greg Hammond, working with Westminster's bookkeeper, is continuing his fiscal oversight by revising the expense submission process to improve tracking to budget and facilitate reimbursements.

Session approved the monthly financial statements for September 2025. As of September 30, 2025, Westminster received \$201,330 in pledged contributions (YTD budget \$204,900) and \$43,211 in rental income (YTD budget \$33,750), contributing to a total operating income of \$291,879 (YTD budget \$278,025).

Total disbursements were \$402,267 (YTD budget \$392,312), slightly but not significantly higher than budget. We remain confident in the congregation's faithful giving, increased rental income, and the prudent management of church resources. Copies of the September 30, 2025 financial statements will be available in the back of the sanctuary.

3. Celebrating 75 Years of Westminster

Session reflected on the recent joyous anniversary celebration by walking the Westminster timeline as a group. We saw common themes carry through our history: social justice, women in ministry, immigrant rights and support, value of music in our ministry, and value of community and connection.

We offered thanks to Barbara Riihimaki and Linda Geisler, and the over 30 other individuals who assisted in one or more elements of the celebration.

If you have not visited the timeline, the photographic history, and important Westminster artifacts, or taken the scavenger hunt - make sure to take time after an upcoming service. An official history of Westminster will be ready soon!

Linda Geisler reported that the dedicated 75th Anniversary Campaign raised \$51,000! 20% of funds will support our mission partners and 80% will strengthen Westminster's endowment for future generations. You can still make your donation here: Westminster 75th Anniversary Campaign
