Session Highlights: March 27, 2024 Meeting

In our February Session meeting, the Session identified five investigative sub-groups to examine creative ways to close our budget gaps. These teams were introduced to the congregation at the Annual Meeting and outlined in more detail in the March 22 Westminster weekly e-mail. Three teams provided updates to Session at our March 27 meeting. All teams are still in need of volunteers. Please contact Session members below if you can help.

Sell or Develop Part of Church Property – Contact Craig Schramm if you can help.

Update: Westminster Presbyterian Church is not the only church in this presbytery experiencing declining church attendance and budget deficits. There is an organization called **Trinity Centres**, located in Canada, that specializes in supporting churches to lovingly preserve, restore, and/ or repurpose their property. A letter of support will be crafted by Julie and Janet to the Presbytery of Southern New England (PSNE) Board of Trustees who will be considering this organization at

the PSNE level at their April meeting.

Ministry Team Highlights:

Engage - Engage brought a list of 14 individuals to be removed from the membership. The reasons for removal include, those who have transferred membership, some at their request, and others who have not been attending for a long time and have not responded to multiple inquiries over the last several years. The Session voted to remove these names from the roles with regret.

Pledge update - We have achieved 83% of our pledge goal of \$300,000 with a total of 64 pledges received to date.

Buildings and Grounds – The rains continue to challenge our roof. Masonry work needs to be completed before the roof repairs commence. Masonry work will begin this month weather permitting. Roof repairs have begun.

Nominating Committee - is in need of a Deacon to serve on the Nominating Committee. They are also seeking names of individuals who are willing to serve as Elders or Deacons for the next 1-3 years. Please contact Art Riihimaki, chair of the nominating committee if you are interested.

Finance – a summary of the budget is below. We are currently ahead of the projected pledge income due to the number of people who pay their pledges for the entire year in January. This is not expected to continue. The overall operating budget deficit is due to the fact that our budget was a deficit budget from the beginning.
