David MacMeekin

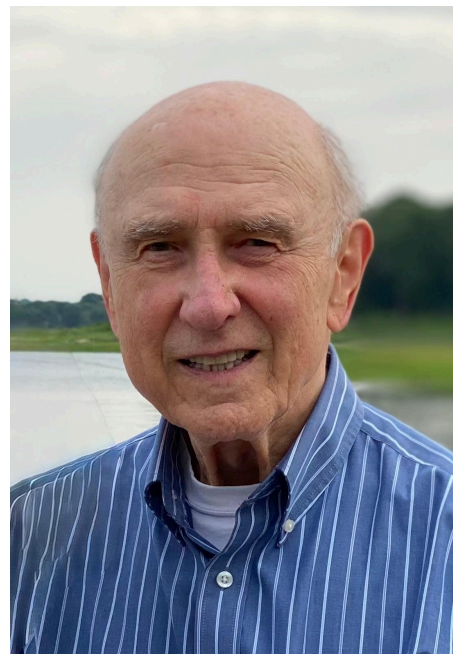
