

What Are Personal Pronouns and Why Do They Matter?

In English, whether we realize it or not, people frequently refer to us using pronouns when speaking about us. Often, when speaking of a singular human in the third person, these pronouns have a gender implied -- such as "he" to refer to a man/boy or "she" to refer to a woman/girl. These associations are not always accurate or helpful.

Often, people make assumptions about the gender of another person based on the person's appearance or name. These assumptions aren't always correct, and the act of making an assumption (even if correct) sends a potentially harmful message -- that people have to look a certain way to demonstrate the gender that they are or are not.

Using someone's correct personal pronouns is a way to respect them and create an inclusive environment, just as using a person's name can be a way to respect them. Just as it can be offensive or even harassing to make up a nickname for someone and call them that nickname against their will, it can be offensive or harassing to guess at someone's pronouns and refer to them using those pronouns if that is not how that person wants to be known. Or, worse, actively choosing to ignore the pronouns someone has stated that they go by could imply the oppressive notion that intersex, transgender, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming people do not or should not exist.

When we refer to "personal" pronouns, we don't mean that these pronouns are necessarily private information (generally they are not), we mean that they are pronouns referring to a unique and individual person.

Session met for its regular stated meeting on April 27. General Presbyter Shannan Vance-Ocampo and COM Representative Susan Labins were in attendance, along with Pam Rekow, chair of Westminster's MR&P Committee, in order to support some discussions about the Senior Pastor's job description. Here are the highlights from the meeting:

Brief updates were shared regarding the three strategic initiatives that are currently ongoing:

- Long-range planning (Led by Elder Tom Buckley): The team plans to conduct interviews with individuals and organizations external to Westminster, and they discussed how to communicate their progress to Westminster and if/when to invite involvement of the congregation and other church leaders.
- Staff role descriptions (Led by Elder Larry Carr): The team is working on 9 job descriptions currently; the pastor/head of staff job description was shared prior to the Session meeting for initial discussions.
- Communications (Led by Elder Greg Hammond): The team has outlined their goals and are right on schedule. They celebrated an early success with the writing of a press release that led to a front page article in the Hartford Courant on our recent Easter egg hunt!

A portion of time was dedicated toward discussion of the draft Senior Pastor's job description that was shared by the strategic initiative team. Questions were discussed regarding which responsibilities belong in the job description, how granular it should be, and what is truly the essence of the role of a Pastor vs. what is expected of a "Head of Staff". The Strategic Imperative Team has subsequently invited our Sr. Pastor to join their team.

Team reports:

- Sustain: Rentals are picking up; Elder John Rhine will be away in May
- Engage: The team is preparing for a spring clean-up/BBQ event in May; Julie is planning to offer a new members class soon
- Flourish: Working on gauging interest in a confirmation class
- Worship: A free-will offering on June 11 and the loose offerings received on June 12 will go to the music scholar program
- Serve: Participants/supporters of the Foodshare Walk for Hunger will collect donations for the Westminster Team after worship on May 8 and May 15; updates were shared about the two upcoming Puerto Rico mission trips
- New leadership is currently needed for the Endowment Committee and the Nominating Committee
- David Hall was removed as a check signer, which was a necessary action for the church's bookkeeping and banking records.
- New Session partners were selected for the next round of one-onone meetings in May.
